Vegetable classes

Any variety may be entered, and should be named where possible, but each entrant may show only one variety unless stated.

- 1. 6 pickling shallots (max 30mm) diameter
- 2. 6 exhibition shallots (over 30mm) diameter
- 3. 3 bulbs of garlic
- 4. 3 onions (under 250gm)
- 5. 3 onions (over 250gm)
- 6. 3 parsnips with tops trimmed to 75mm
- 7. 5 runner beans
- 8. 5 French beans
- 9. 3 carrots with tops trimmed to 75mm
- 10. 5 potatoes white
- 11. 5 potatoes coloured
- 12. 3 courgettes
- 13. 5 tomatoes, other than cherry, with calyx
- 14. 10 cherry tomatoes with calyx
- 15. Longest runner bean, point to point
- 16. 3 peppers of any single variety
- 17. 3 beetroot
- 18. 3 squash or gourds of any single variety
- 19. Collection of any 6 vegetables, one of each kind not to exceed 60cm x 90cm
- 20. Heaviest pumpkin

RHS GUIDELINES WILL BE FOLLOWED WHEREVER POSSIBLE



Flower classes

- 21. Collection of 6 kinds of cut flowers, one of each with foliage attached
- 22. 3 pompom dahlias
- 23. 3 dahlias other than pompom (all one variety)
- 24. 3 sunflowers
- 25. 3 stems of roses (spray or single)
- 26. 3 stems of Echinacea (coneflower)
- 27. 6 sweet peas
- 28. A vase of garden flowers (seed heads & grasses may be included)
- 29. Flowering house plant
- 30. Foliage plant
- 31. Cactus plant

Classes 29-31 to be one root only, shown in a container no more than 20 cm in diameter, in which the plant was grown.

Fruit and Produce (judged with egg classes)

- 32. 3 cooking apples
- 33. 3 eating apples
- 34. 3 pears
- 35. 5 fruit of the plum family
- 36. 10 raspberries
- 37. 10 blackberries
- 38. Collection of 4 fruits, one of each kind
- 39. 1 bottle of homemade cordial (natural not kit)
- 40. 1 bottle of homemade fruit gin
- 41. 1 bottle of fruit spirit other than gin

Hints and tips

If you have not entered before and are thinking of doing so this year you may find these general guidelines useful:

- ❖ Exhibits should be matched for uniformity of shape and size.
- Largest is not always judged as best.
- Naming varieties helps, for example 'Gardener's Delight' (tomatoes), 'Early Nantes' (carrots).
- Presentation is important if entries are close in terms of quality. For example, shown on proper plates.
- Some decoration or staging can help. For example a single beetroot leaf under the beets or onions/shallots shown on sand/grain.
- ❖ Simple works best not too many leaves or stalks.
- Should you wish your produce to be auctioned, please remove any part of your display that you want to keep. The auctioneer will collect items from the tables.
- Should you feel unsure on staging or have any other query on exhibiting, please email dscountryshows@gmail.com

Class specific guidelines include:

- Tomatoes should be shown stalk up.
- Onions should not be too skinned. Tops should be neatly tied, and you should indicate if they are set or seed.

Flower Craft classes

- 62. An Autumn wreath size 50cm x 50cm x 50 cm max
- 63. Buttonhole for a gentleman
- 64. Centre table arrangement, size 25cm x 25cm x 25cm max
- 65. Miniature flower arrangement, size 10cm x 10cm x10cm max
- 66. Collection of 6 herbs, named.

Rules

- Postal entries should reach the Show Secretary, Mrs L Grasmeder, High Street Farm, High Street, Upper Dean, Huntingdon, Cambs., PE28 0LY, by Wednesday, 30th August 2023. All other entries should be made in person on Wednesday, 30th or Thursday 31st August 2023 between 7.00 and 9.00 pm.
- 2. All exhibits must be presented at the venue ready for staging between 8 am 10 am on Show day, 2nd September 2023.
- 3. All exhibits should be properly tagged with the exhibitor's number before being presented at the hall. Tickets should not be stuck on lids but on the side of the container.
- 4. Entries must be delivered to the hall, tagged with the exhibitor's number, NO LATER THAN 10am.
- 5. Entry tickets for postal entries will be available from the stewards' desk at staging.
- 6. All reasonable care will be taken of the exhibits and no one other than the Judges, or Stewards, will be allowed in the hall between 10 am and 2 pm.
- 7. All classes will be judged, but certificates will only be awarded at the judges' discretion.
- 8. Exhibits should be collected at 4.45 pm. Any exhibits left after this time will be auctioned in aid of charity.
- 9. Insurance of the cups/rose bowls is the responsibility of the winners. Trophies should be returned 2 weeks before the show.
- 10. It is an absolute condition of entry to the Show ground that dog owners clean up after their dogs. Bins are provided for that purpose.
- 11. All dogs will be kept on a lead and under control at all times.

Classes 42-48 should have competitor/class label attached to the jar not the lid.

Egg classes – (judged with fruit and produce)

To be judged for matching size, colour and texture of shell

 To be broken by the judge to determine freshness
 (there is no need to stage this entry, a plate will be provided)

Bakery classes – (open to all aged 16 and over)

- 52. Four squares flap jack
- 53. 8" Victoria Sandwich cake
- 54. 8" Fruit Cake
- 55. A Round of Shortbread
- 56. 4 Scones
